C&R Mfg. Installs Okuma Pallet System

C&R Manufacturing, Shawnee, Kansas, has installed a new Okuma MB5000 HMC pallet system.

The precision manufacturing firm, which offers machining, welding, assembly, laser part marking and inspection, started out in the basement of founder Ron Wosel's home in 1979.


The new Okuma pallet system, purchased from Hartwig, Inc., features a 10 pallets circular pool, a 324 tool magazine, a full 4th axis, and a 12,000-rpm 40-taper spindle

"We needed the new pallet system (the company's second) to improve our efficiency, accuracy and productivity," stated Wosel. "It replaces a 20-year-old pallet system. Hartwig was very valuable during the process. They helped translate the programs from the old system to work on the new Okuma system. We have worked with Hartwig since the early '80s and have always found them to be a great partner to work with."

C&R's 18 employees operate in a 32,000-sq.-ft. facility with an impressive array of CNC equipment. Wosel noted that the average tenure of the company's employees is 19-23 years.

"Our great employees are a key factor in our success," commented Wosel. "On-time delivery is always a major focus for us. We are the top supplier (in quality and delivery) for many of our customers."

Wosel noted that the firm recently received a KC Small Business award in the 25 Businesses with less than 25 Employees category for the KC area.
