EMJ-KC Installs Second Hautau CNC Tube Cutting System

EMJ, a full-line steel service center, has installed its second Hautau CNC tube cutting system, an RC70 model, in its Kansas City facility.

The ISO-certified company handles more than 40,000 sizes, shapes and grades of tubing, pipe and specialty products in carbon and alloy steel, stainless steel, aluminum and cast iron. First process cutting, shearing and sawing are also offered.

The Kansas City facility, one of 35 centers across North America, serves Kansas, western Missouri, Nebraska and southwest Iowa. It has 19 sales representatives (11 inside and 6 outside).

The second Hautau CNC tube cutoff system was needed to keep up with customer demand and to handle larger tube. It can cut tube up to 7" in diameter with 7/8" walls. It can also chamfer the ID and OD edges on both ends. "The second Hautau expands our size capability and allows us more flexibility," noted Brian Crane, general sales manager.

"Combining our 16 saws and two tube lasers we are able to offer a wide variety of first process capacities and capabilities," noted David Baltuska, general manager. "The second Hautau CNC saw expands our capabilities even more."

EMJ (Jorgensen Steel and Aluminum) was founded in 1924 and has been in the KC area for over 46 years.


